RESTAURANTS & FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

- ✓ May increase indoor capacity to 50% with proper social distancing
- ✓ Outdoor seating encouraged

RETAIL

- ✓ May operate up to 50% capacity indoors

MUSEUMS & LIBRARIES

- ✓ May operate up to 50% capacity if permitted by local governments

GYMS & FITNESS CENTERS

- ✓ May operate up to 50% capacity
- ✓ Self-sanitize machines and surfaces after use

AMUSEMENT PARKS

- ✓ May submit re-opening plan to the State

PROFESSIONAL SPORTS VENUES

- ✓ Professional sports teams are welcome in Florida
- ✓ Professional sports venues may open and operate for games, events and training

VACATION RENTALS

- ✓ Counties may seek approval to operate vacation rentals by submitting a written request and county vacation rental safety plan to the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation

ELECTIVE SURGERIES

- ✓ Elective surgeries may continue if a facility has adequate PPE, hospital bed surge capacity and works with the local community to prevent and/or contain outbreaks in long-term care facilities

BARBER SHOPS & SALONS

- ✓ Barber shops, hair salons and nail salons may operate while adhering to safety protocols effective May 11

SCHOOLS

- ✓ Students continue with distance learning

LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES

- ✓ Visitation in long-term facilities prohibited for COVID-19
- ✓ Hospitals required to test all individuals before discharge to long-term care facilities
- ✓ Long-term care facilities required to transfer COVID-19 positive residents if the facility is not equipped for appropriate care

Applicants must review and submit all of the required documents and attachments to qualify for assistance. Paper copies are available for distribution at County libraries and on County buses.
- Brevard County has submitted a request to DBPR to allow short-term vacation rentals to reopen.
- The Salvation Army Brevard Domestic Violence Program has implemented a “phone text/web chat” communication tool for survivors/victims to safely utilize in order to seek help or assistance. - Health First has added temperature checks at all hospitals and clinical facilities. Temperature checks are mandatory for associates, vendors, and visitors.
- Space Coast Area Transit continues no fares and Saturday transit service until further notice.

Titusville	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• City Hall is now open to the public with hours of operations from 9 AM to Noon, and 1 PM to 4 PM. Extra precautions are being taken during the reopening including issuing antibacterial/antimicrobial washable masks to all employees, physical distancing measures, and extra disinfecting cleaning of high traffic areas and touch points.
West Melbourne	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• City recreation programs, classes, and facility reservations are being taken for activities in July.• Although the park is open, the Space Coast Field of Dreams ball fields and playground, the splash pad, and the skate park within West Melbourne Community Park remain closed. The skate park will re-open second, upon Phase 2 and after ordered repair parts arrive and repairs are made. Field of Dreams will open third. This will be upon Phase 2, after field repairs are made, and after new operating procedures are put in place.

- A \$2 million grant from the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration will provide crisis intervention services, mental health and substance abuse treatment, and other related recovery supports for children and adults impacted by COVID-19. - Agency for Health Care Administration issued Emergency Rule [59AER20-2](#) and Emergency Rule [59AER20-3](#). These rules require nursing homes and assisted living facilities to grant access to the Florida Department of Health (DOH) or an authorized agent for the purposes of infection control and prevention and mandate COVID-19 testing of facility staff, including off-duty staff, by DOH or an authorized agent. All long-term care facility residents are also being tested.

Always Exempt

- Bottled water (unflavored, uncarbonated)
- Canned food, including meats, vegetables, fruits, peanut butter and other nonperishable items
- First aid kits
- Prescription and nonprescription medications (all Rx and most over-the-counter are exempt)
- Baby food and formulas
- Feminine hygiene products
