World Health Organization Medical Mask Fact

The prolonged use of medical masks can be uncomfortable. However, it does not lead to CO2 intoxication nor oxygen deficiency.

While wearing a medical mask, make sure it fits properly and that it is tight enough to allow you to breathe normally. Do not re-use a disposable mask and always change it as soon as it gets damp.

* Medical masks (also known as surgical masks) are flat or pleated; they are affixed to the head with straps or have ear loops.

- The UF/Brevard Extension Service is hosting two farmer's market locations where eligible residents can obtain CARES Act dollars for vendor purchases.

 - Fridays at the Welcome Center, 419 South Hopkins Avenue, Titusville, 3-6 PM
- [Second Harvest Food Bank is expanding their home delivery food service](#) to Brevard residents. Recipients must be seniors, homebound individuals, individuals with a disability, and those in the risk group for contracting COVID. West Melbourne

- All businesses in West Melbourne must post their face mask policy.
- Employers of ten specific essential businesses must require their employees, except for exemptions, to wear masks while inside public areas of their business.
- Customers of specific essential businesses must wear a mask while inside the essential businesses, with certain exemptions.
- Additional West Melbourne businesses, at their discretion, may opt-into the emergency ordinance such that the Police Department is able to enforce the ordinance within their particular business.
- Municipal buildings are closed to the public except for the purpose of City Council and City board meetings, and for voting on election days.

State/National Updates

- Governor DeSantis issued [Executive Order 20-193](#) extending Executive Order 20-179 providing local government bodies with additional time to notice their meetings
- Governor DeSantis issued [Executive Order 20-192](#), authorizing The Department of Business and Professional Regulation to ensure all restaurants implement employee screening protocols pursuant to guidance developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- Governor DeSantis issued [Executive Order 20-180](#), extending Executive Order 20-94 regarding limited extension of mortgage foreclosure and eviction relief until September 1.
- [Governor DeSantis announced the formation of a task force to explore the safe and limited reopening of long-term care facilities](#)
- [Governor DeSantis revealed the state's new Covid testing strategy, prioritizing testing for symptomatic individuals and those over 65](#)
- The Agency for Persons with Disabilities (APD) issued [Emergency Rule 65GER20-1](#), which requires all APD-licensed homes and APD-operated residential facilities to conduct Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) testing of staff every two weeks. This action is being taken to try to stop the spread of COVID-19 into facilities overseen by APD
