- Brevard County Public Schools continue to offer meals for all children up to 18 years old at various food distribution sites through December 31.

West Melbourne

- [The masking requirement in essential businesses has been extended to September 28](#)
- All businesses in West Melbourne must post their face mask policy
- Customers of specific essential businesses must wear a mask while inside the essential businesses, with certain exemptions
- Additional West Melbourne businesses, at their discretion, may opt-into the emergency ordinance such that the Police Department is able to enforce the ordinance within their particular business
- Municipal buildings are closed to the public except for the purpose of City Council and City board meetings, and for voting on election days
