- Brevard County Public Schools continue to offer meals for all children up to 18 years old at various food distribution sites through December 31.

- The county has partnered with the Children's Hunger Project to distribute 39,573 weekend meals to date
- Brevard County's "Pop up Pantry" feeding operation has distributed 1.97 million meals to date. From 9/30 - 10/6, served 2,969 cars and 35 walk-ups for a total 3,116 families

State/National Updates

- Governor DeSantis issued [Executive Order 20-246](#) extending Executive Order 20-69, which suspends any Florida Statute that requires a quorum to be present in person or requires a local government body to meet at a specific public place; local government bodies may utilize communications media technology, such as telephonic and video conferencing
- [Executive Order 20-211](#) Limited extension of mortgage foreclosure and eviction relief ended on 10/1 and has not been renewed
- [CDC issued an order temporarily halting residential evictions \(not including foreclosures on home mortgages\) until December 31, 2020](#). Per the CDC's order, [declaration form # 0920-1303](#) must be submitted to those with the rights to evict or remove persons from their residence
- CDC extended the [No Sail Order](#) for cruise ships through October 31, 2020. This order continues to suspend passenger operations on cruise ships with the capacity to carry at least 250 passengers in waters subject to U.S. jurisdiction
