CDC recommendations for staying safe during Halloween



- When trick or treating or participating in other Halloween activities with people outside your household, wear a mask. You can make it fun by making your mask part of your costume, but when it comes to slowing the spread of COVID-19, a costume mask is not a substitute for a cloth mask. Also, do not wear a costume mask over a cloth mask. It can make breathing more difficult.
- If you're heading out to trick-or-treat this year, or planning to
 put candy out for trick-or treaters, remember to avoid direct
 contact with trick-or-treaters and give treats away outdoors if
 possible. Set up a station with individually bagged treats for kids
 to take, wash hands before handling treats, and wear a mask.

- Rental/Mortgage Assistance Program and Utility/Security Deposit Program applicants must review and submit all required documents and attachments to qualify for assistance listed on HHS Coronavirus Assistance Program Application Form
- Visit the Brevard CARES website for details on the <u>Small Business and</u> <u>Nonprofit Organizations grant on-line</u> <u>application</u>.
 - Small businesses and nonprofit organizations may be eligible for grants up to \$10,000 to offset expenses and lost revenue related to impacts from COVID.
- Residents Financially Impacted by COVID-19 May Be Eligible for A/C, Heating Unit Replacement Funds.
 - Applications are available at all 17 county libraries
- Workforce Recovery Assistance
 Program is available through
 December 30, 2020. This program aids Small Businesses (fewer than 50 employees) impacted by COVID-19. businesses rehire their laid off or furloughed employee(s) by funding hourly wages.

State and National Updates

- The Florida Department of Health released recommendations for staying safe during Halloween activities. These include:
 - Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds before and after preparing goodie bags
 - While visiting a pumpkin patches or orchards use hand sanitizer before touching pumpkins or picking apples
 - Attend a small, outdoor and open-air costume parade or have a virtual costume contest
- The Florida Division of Emergency Management issued Emergency Order 20-011 on October 22, 2020. Per the order, Long Term Care Facilities can now
 - Set their own limitations on the numbers of visitors
 - Outdoor visiting is allowed, even if the facility has active COVID cases
 - Children of all ages can now visit facilities
