CDC Guidance on Severe Weather and COVID-19



- Understand your planning may be different this year because of the need to protect yourself and others from COVID-19.
- Give yourself more time than usual to prepare your emergency food, water, and medicine supplies. Home delivery is the safest choice for buying disaster supplies. If in-person shopping is your only choice, take steps to protect your and others' health when running essential errands.
- Protect yourself and others when filling prescriptions by limiting in-person visits to the pharmacy. Sign up for mail order delivery or call in your prescription ahead of time and use drive-through windows or curbside pickup, if available.
- When you check on neighbors and friends, be sure to follow social distancing recommendations (staying at least 6 feet from others) and other CDC safety recommendations.


- Rental/Mortgage Assistance Program and Utility/Security Deposit Program are available for applicants who submit all required documents and attachments to qualify for assistance as listed on the <u>Housing & Human</u> <u>Services Coronavirus Assistance</u> <u>Program Application Form</u>.
- Visit the Brevard CARES website for details on the <u>Small Business and</u> <u>Nonprofit Organizations grant on-line</u> <u>application</u>.
 - Small businesses and nonprofit organizations may be eligible for grants up to \$10,000 to offset expenses and lost revenue related to impacts from COVID-19.
- <u>Residents financially impacted by</u> <u>COVID-19 can apply for the A/C,</u> <u>Heating Unit Replacement Funds.</u>
 - <u>Paper applications are</u> <u>available</u> at county libraries and community Centers.
- Workforce Recovery Assistance Program is available through December 30, 2020. This program aids small businesses (fewer than 50 employees) impacted by COVID-19.
