## CDC Guidance for COVID-19



COVID-19 can spread anywhere – even places where you feel safe, like your home. Keep prevent covid-19 inside your home by:

- In shared spaces, stay about 2 arm lengths apart. Remember that people can spread the virus even if they don't have symptoms, and wear a mask around others
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer, if soap and water aren't available.
- Monitor your health daily, watch for fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19.
- Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces in shared spaces
- Avoid sharing personal household items
- Do not share items such as dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, or towels with other people in your home, wash these items thoroughly after using them
- If someone gets sick, separate the person who is sick from other people in your home

### EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 2020-EO-07

#### *What stays the same?*

- ✓ Continues **full parental choice**. While in-person education is steadily increasing, some families will still need flexibility for the spring semester due to medical vulnerabilities.
- ✓ Continues **financial flexibility and stability** for school districts and charter schools.
- ✓ Continues **flexibilities for state scholarship students** at private schools.
- ✓ Continues **guarantee of full panoply of services** for at-risk students.
- ✓ Continues **requirement to progress monitor** students.

#### *Spring 2021 Improvements:*

- ✓ Requires **educational interventions** for students who may be falling behind, especially Florida's most vulnerable students.
- ✓ **Rewards school districts** and public charter schools that have exceeded their projected enrollment.

### State and National Updates

- On December 1, Governor DeSantis issued Emergency Order #20-EO-07, which allows parents to choose in-person or virtual learning, mandates additional step to identify and reduce gaps experienced by virtual users
- [On December 2, the CDC updated its quarantine recommendations](#). Per the new guidance, the CDC continues to suggest a 14 day quarantine period, but allows local health authorities to shorten quarantine based on the following conditions:
  - Quarantine can end after Day 10 without testing and if no symptoms have been reported during daily monitoring
  - Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a tests negative and if no symptoms were reported during daily monitoring
  - Both options, required continued symptom monitoring and masking through Day 14
