CDC Guidance for COVID-19



COVID-19 can spread anywhere – even places where you feel safe, like your home. Keep prevent covid-19 inside your home by:

- In shared spaces, stay about 2 arm lengths apart. Remember that people can spread the virus even if they don't have symptoms, and wear a mask around others
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer, if soap and water aren't available.
- Monitor your health daily, watch for fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19.
- Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces in shared spaces
- · Avoid sharing personal household items
- Do not share items such as dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, or towels with other people in your home, wash these items thoroughly after using them
- If someone gets sick, separate the person who is sick from other people in your home

Brevard County:

- Rental/Mortgage Assistance Program and Utility/Security Deposit Program are available for applicants who submit all required documents and attachments to qualify for assistance as listed on the <u>Housing & Human</u> <u>Services Coronavirus Assistance</u> <u>Program Application Form</u>.
- Visit the Brevard CARES website for details on the <u>Small Business and</u> <u>Nonprofit Organizations grant on-line</u> <u>application</u>.
 - Small businesses and nonprofit organizations may be eligible for grants up to \$10,000 to offset expenses and lost revenue related to impacts from COVID-19.
- Residents financially impacted by COVID-19 can apply for the A/C, Heating Unit Replacement Funds.
 - Paper applications are available at county libraries and community Centers.
- Workforce Recovery Assistance Program
 - The application period has now ended
 - The program is available through December 30, 2020, and aids small businesses (fewer than 50 employees) impacted by COVID-19.

Spring 2021 Improvements:

- Continues full parental choice. While in-person education is steadily increasing, some families will still need flexibility for the spring semester due to medical vulnerabilities.
- Continues financial flexibility and stability for school districts and charter schools.
- Continues flexibilities for state scholarship students at private schools.
- Continues guarantee of full panoply of services for at-risk students.
- Continues requirement to progress monitor students.

- Requires educational interventions for students who may be falling behind, especially Florida's most
- Rewards school districts and public charter schools that have exceeded their projected enrollment.

State and National Updates

- On December 1, Governor DeSantis issued Emergency Order #20-E0-07, which allows parents to choose in-person or virtual learning, mandates additional step to identify and reduce gaps experienced by virtual users
- On December 2, the CDC updated it quarantine recommendations. Per the new guidance, the CDC continues to suggest a 14 day quarantine period, but allows local health authorities to shorten quarantine based on the following conditions:
 - Quarantine can end after Day 10 without testing and if no symptoms have been reported during daily monitoring
 - Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a tests negative and if no symptoms were reported during daily monitoring
 - Both options, required continued symptom monitoring and masking through Day 14
