## **CDC Guidance for COVID-19**



#### On December 2, the CDC updated it quarantine recommendations.

Per the new guidance, the CDC continues to suggest a 14 day quarantine period, but allows local health authorities to shorten quarantine based on the following conditions:

- Quarantine can end after Day 10 without testing and if no symptoms have been reported during daily monitoring
- Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a tests negative and if no symptoms were reported during daily monitoring

In both cases, additional criteria (e.g., continued symptom monitoring and masking through Day 14) must be met

#### **Brevard County:**

- Rental/Mortgage Assistance Program and Utility/Security Deposit Program are available for applicants who submit all required documents and attachments to qualify for assistance as listed on the <u>Housing & Human</u> <u>Services Coronavirus Assistance</u> <u>Program Application Form</u>.
- Visit the Brevard CARES website for details on the <u>Small Business and</u> <u>Nonprofit Organizations grant on-line</u> <u>application</u>.
  - Small businesses and nonprofit organizations may be eligible for grants up to \$10,000 to offset expenses and lost revenue related to impacts from COVID-19.
- Workforce Recovery Assistance
   Program
  - The application period has now ended
  - The program is available through December 30, 2020, and aids small businesses (fewer than 50 employees) impacted by COVID-19.

# **COVID-19 Vaccine Key Points**

- In Florida, the State and the Governor will make the final decision on vaccine priorities and how they will be implemented
- Initially there will be limited vaccine availability, resulting in the need for a phased approach by priority groups
- Current vaccine requires two shots, so 10 million doses is actually 5 million people
- It will take some time before it is widely available for mass dispensing

   Vaccine
