#### **Background Information:**

The Town of Melbourne Beach (including Town Commissioners individually, Town Officials, and various other parties) are Defendants in Brevard County Circuit Court Case No. 05-2022-CA-053294-XXXX-XX filed by Petitioner Alison Dennington as an election contest suit.

On July 26, 2023, the Town Attorney received an email communication from Ms. Dennington proposing settlement terms and resolution of the above-referenced litigation. On July 28, 2023, the Town Attorney received a second email communication from Ms. Dennington clarifying and detailing a settlement proposal.

Fla. Stat. Sec. 286.011(8), F.S. permits the Town Commission to meet in private with its legal counsel to discuss settlement negotiations or strategy sessions related to litigation expenditures. The Section requires strict compliance with requirements for notice and recording of the session.

If approved, a meeting date will be selected (anticipating August 16, 2023), and the Town will provide notice of the session in accordance with the statutory section.

#### **Recommendation:**

Approve noticing and holding pending litigation meeting/session in accordance with Fla. Stat. Sec. 286.011(8), F.S.

Ms. Dennington,

Thank you for your email. I wanted to take a moment to acknowledge my receipt. I feel that it is appropriate to extend you that courtesy given the cooperative tone and spirit of your email.

Unfortunately, I do not have the ability to unilaterally agree to any terms of settlement, but I am certainly willing to discuss the same with the Town Commission. I will likely request that the Town Commission publicly notice and schedule a shade meeting/executive session to consider your proposal.

I think my assistant Cathie was in the process of scheduling hearing time on our Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings for October 3, 2023 @ 10:00 a.m. with you. If you don't mind, I would like to reserve that date and prepare a Notice of Hearing so that we don't have to push the hearing date out further if a resolution is not reached. We will then have two (2) months prior to the hearing date to explore your proposal. You have my word that I will make a genuine attempt to explore settlement options with the Town Commission. In the meantime, I assume that you object to the content of our Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings and that there is no need to discuss the Motion in an attempt to resolve it prior to preparing the Notice of Hearing (as required by Judge Paulk's rule). If you would like to discuss the Motion prior to our preparation of the Notice of Hearing, let me know. Otherwise, please let me know if we may prepare and file a Notice of Hearing.

I understand that you are representing yourself pro se in the elections contest suit, but due to the fact that Mr. Meloon has informed me that he represents you on public records matters, I am copying him on this response for his awareness since you reference public records issues below. I am also copying Ms. Pastorius for her awareness in an abundance of caution (since you reference the Code Enforcement appeal case below). If either Mr. Meloon or Ms. Pastorius believe I should be communicating with them rather than Ms. Dennington directly, please let me know.
